Re water troughs

According to a recent CLA meeting, a degree of poaching around water troughs would be considered a better outcome than poaching of riverbanks or ditch edges. Water troughs should ideally be situated away from existing water courses in order to avoid run-off. Farmers would not be expected to relocate all water troughs to achieve this, but if new troughs are being installed or there is a plan to move them anyway, this should be taken into account. Also worth considering whether a concrete base should be laid to avoid excessive poaching.

Of course, it would be down to the individual inspector to decide if a breach were occurring, so just hope you get one that lives in the real world!
